Division of the state power

- No hierarchy between federal power and regional powers
 - Conflicts of interest are not easy to settle
 - Need to compromise
 - Delays in decision making
- Growing decentralisation of the power to the regions
 - Great costs but maintaining peace between the regions
 - Especially in Flanders a claim for more autonomy by some political parties
- Result
 - Not so much unity as stated in the official motto
